



# Acts.





Now in the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen (who had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch) and Saul. <sup>2</sup> While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, “Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.” <sup>3</sup> So after they had fasted and prayed, they placed their hands on them and sent them off.

Christians first at Antioch.

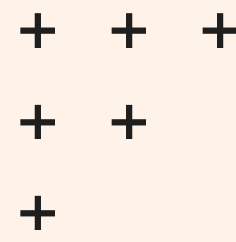

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## Paul's Mission in Cyprus, Galatia, and Pamphylia


- Paul's route from Antioch (Syria) to Salamis
- Paul's route from Salamis to Paphos
- Paul's route from Paphos to Perga
- Paul's route from Perga to Pisidian Antioch via the western route
- Paul's route from Pisidian Antioch to Iconium, Lystra, and Derbe
- Paul's route from Derbe to Pisidian Antioch
- Paul's route from Pisidian Antioch to Perga via the central route
- Paul's route from Perga to Antioch (Syria)



ACTS 13:4-5








They traveled through the whole island until they came to Paphos. There they met a Jewish sorcerer and false prophet named Bar-Jesus,<sup>7</sup> who was an attendant of the proconsul, Sergius Paulus. The proconsul, an intelligent man, sent for Barnabas and Saul because he wanted to hear the word of God.<sup>8</sup> But Elymas the sorcerer (for that is what his name means) opposed them and tried to turn the proconsul from the faith.

Then Saul, who was also called Paul, filled with the Holy Spirit, looked straight at Elymas and said, <sup>10</sup> “You are a child of the devil and an enemy of everything that is right! You are full of all kinds of deceit and trickery. Will you never stop perverting the right ways of the Lord? <sup>11</sup> Now the hand of the Lord is against you. You are going to be blind for a time, not even able to see the light of the sun.”

Immediately mist and darkness came over him, and he groped about, seeking someone to lead him by the hand. <sup>12</sup> When the proconsul saw what had happened, he believed, for he was amazed at the teaching about the Lord.

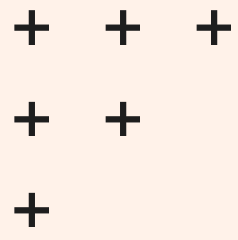




Someone in the crowd said to him, “Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me.”
