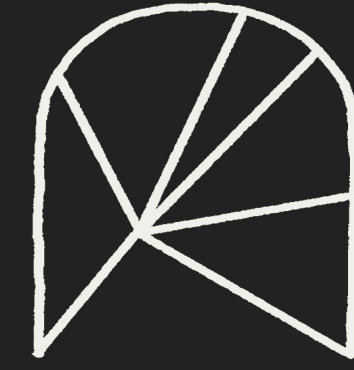

Materialism is fundamentally a focus on and a trust in what we can touch and possess. We have an inescapable tendency to link who we are with what we have. In exposing materialism, the real issue for Christ is not the stuff around us but the stuff within. Simply stated, coveting is desiring stuff too much or desiring too much stuff. Materialism is what happens when coveting has cash to spend. Covetousness is choosing earthly trinkets over eternal treasure. Covetousness chains the heart to things that are passing away. The sin of covetousness is not that we have stuff; it's that our stuff has us.

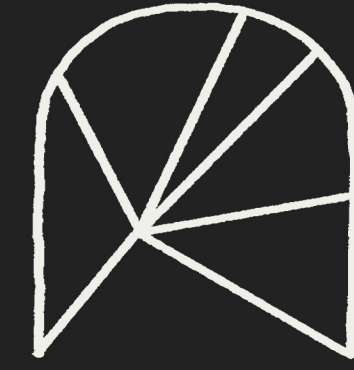

A Generous Heart

MATTHEW 6:19-24

II Corinthians 8:2-5;9 ^{NIV}

In the midst of a very severe trial, their overflowing joy and their extreme poverty welled up in rich generosity. ³ For I testify that they gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability. Entirely on their own, ⁴ they urgently pleaded with us for the privilege of sharing in this service to the Lord's people. ⁵ And they exceeded our expectations: **They gave themselves first of all to the Lord**, and then by the will of God also to us... ⁹ For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, **that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich.**
